

JOPLIN OUTLAWS TEAM POLICIES AND COACH / PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

The following are team policies and a code of conduct for coaches and players of the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club. All policies will be governed by the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club Board of Directors.

Violation of any of the below policies may result in suspension or expulsion from the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club.

1. All coaches and players are fully responsible for all consequences associated with any unlawful activity. Additionally, there may be team consequences depending upon the nature of the incident.
2. Coaches and players will travel in team-provided and / or team-approved transportation while traveling to and from games. With permission of the coach, it shall be permissible for a player to ride home with the host family or his own parents.
3. Coaches or players unwilling or unable to contribute to the team due to illness, injury, or ability may be released at any time during the season.
4. Coaches and players will respect the rules or desires of the Host Family and the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club. This includes but is not limited to the following:
 - a. Keeping coach and player sleeping areas clean.
 - b. Contacting the Host Family about a players' whereabouts if arriving late (road game travel nights not included).
 - c. Making sleeping arrangements should be made for visiting friends, girl friends and family members in other locations other than the Host Family home, unless approved in advance by the Host Family.
5. Coaches and players will be responsible for personal telephone calls at Host Family homes.
6. Coaches and players are expected to conduct themselves as good citizens, both in the Joplin community and those communities where the team travels. Any damaging of property or causing disturbances deemed unacceptable or inappropriate will result in the coach or player paying for any such damage, providing a written letter of apology, and either suspension or expulsion from the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club.
7. Curfew for players is 1 a.m. The only exception is when transportation from a road game causes players to arrive in Joplin later than 1 a.m. If a Host Family has a different curfew, players are to respect the desires of the Host Family since players are a guest in their home.

Joplin Outlaws' coaches and players represent themselves, their college and university programs, the Joplin community and the Joplin Outlaws Collegiate Baseball Club. Therefore a high standard is expected. Any violation of rules and regulations could result in dismissal from the team as well as notification to player families, college coaches, and schools.
